### **Bateman's Tomb**

Bateman's Tomb project is looking for volunteers!

The Parish Council are owners of the Listed Monument and have been working with the Conservation Heritage Team at the Peak District National Park Authority to come up with a scheme to effect some basic repairs and preserve this unique piece of village history. Having met the PDNPA Team on site, ideas for cutting back vegetation and roots that are lifting sections were discussed with the possibility of a mini dig to uncover the front foundations under the supervision of a qualified archaeologist.

The Parish Council has secured a small grant to assist with the professional help and some initial specialist repairs but is looking for volunteers from within our community who would like to get involved in the practical and research elements that greatly assist this type of project.

One of the main wish list items is for an early photograph of the site – we have close ups of the tomb from various more recent sources but what it looked like in the early part of the century before the boundary railings from the road fell into disrepair would be of great interest.

Please speak to one of the councillors or email the Parish Clerk if you would like to get involved or can help us with an early photograph.

The Middleton History Group, chaired by Henry Brocklehurst, published in 2001 'Our Middleton', a history of the parish written to celebrate the passing of the millennium. More recently an oral history project was undertaken collecting the fascinating recollections of village life from a number of local residents.

Recently there has been discussion on the possibility of a further initiative to identify surviving evidence of Middleton's past, including photographs, maps, title deeds, building plans and other documents.
