PARISH COUNCIL – CLIMATE AND NATURE EMERGENCY GROUP

The new group met in the Village Hall on Monday 7th September to consider local priorities to put forward to the Parish Council Meeting on 16th September.

There was a wide-ranging discussion about how the climate and nature emergency impacts on our community and what we can do practically to help.

The key issues that were reported to the Parish Council Meeting focused on Bradford Dale – the management of the river, the overflow of sewage after heavy rainfall, ash dieback and air quality in Middleton.

The Parish Council will address these concerns with the river keeper from the Haddon Estate and with the Severn Trent Water Authority.

The group will meet again (most likely as a Zoom meeting) once we have some further information about how these issues are being taken forward and to make future plans. THOMAS BATEMAN BI-CENTENARY YEAR 2021 - We reminded residents in the last newsletter that next year is the bi-centenary of the birth of Middleton's best-known resident, Thomas Bateman the celebrated Victorian archaeologist, born on 8th November 1821 in Rowsley. He is buried in the tomb behind the Chapel.

This Grade 2 Listed tomb's surrounds and approaches are being upgraded by the Parish Council, which is responsible for its care.

At its meeting on 16th September, the Parish Council set up a review to consider how the community can best mark the bi-centenary. It will consider at its November meeting proposals coming from the review.
