Climate and Nature Group

The diseased ash tree bordering the picnic garden has now been removed and the stone wall will be repaired as soon as possible. The borders in the picnic garden are already showing signs of the spring flowers that were planted as bulbs. The snowdrops are also growing in the grass bordering the memorial playground. The village planter is also (slowly) springing into life and there should be a very attractive and colourful display as the 'lasagne' of planted layers begins to flower in the Spring.

Initiatives to provide support for the hedgehog population now include providing some suitable shelters in the garden of St Michael and All Angels' church now that the Youlgrave PCC have given permission for this.

Priorities for the group this year will be to maintain the improvements made to the environment in the public areas of the village and to establish the community herb garden so that residents are able to start using the culinary herbs.

Support for the hedgehogs is also important as some may be displaced by the construction work on the Greencroft Farm site.

Litter picks will also be held as there is an increasing amount of litter on the surrounding verges and roadsides.

This group meets on Monday mornings at 11am in the Square for coffee, chat and gardening. The first meeting of 2023 will be held on Monday 23rd January at 11am. New members welcome.
