ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The 2024 Annual Parish Meeting was held on Wednesday 13 March at 7.15pm in the Village Hall. The Annual Report of the work of the parish council will be published in the April edition of 'The Bugle'.

PCSO Anthony Boswell attended the meeting and noted that the Police Rural Crime Team has data tags available to farmers to assist theft recovery. He also raised awareness of the 'Derbyshire Alert' community messaging system. Registration is free to residents and allows you to receive messages about your local area, but also allows you to feed back information to local policing teams. Our District Councillor, Laura Mellstrom is currently raising the issue of Middleton Toilets with the District Council. The toilets are only open between March and October instead of 12 months of the year which was a 50 year agreement made in 1994.

COMMUNITY GREENHOUSE CHANGES ARE HAPPENING BEHIND THE VILLAGE HALL...

The Parish Council has recently obtained funding to make improvements to the area behind the village hall to develop its use for the community.

The old toilet block has a new roof and new doors to make it safe and secure.
